We are prepared to welcome students back on the 23rd of August. For some students, this will be their first time in school for over a year. Our staff is working hard to create a welcoming environment where all students feel a strong sense of belonging and pride in Prairie. The pandemic strengthened our resolve to create a personalized learning environment responsive to student needs.

While we hoped COVID-19 would be firmly behind us, the persistence of this pandemic will continue to impact our school operations. Again, this year, we will have to make quick decisions based on conditions and ask for your patience and flexibility as we respond to this virus.

Please note: Each lowa School District is required to update their return to learn plan for this fall. Our default service model will be <u>all</u> students, <u>fully onsite</u>. We will be starting school Monday, August 23 with <u>all</u> students, <u>fully onsite</u> and will continue with the onsite model. The Hybrid and Online Options were included in the plan to describe these strategies as <u>contingency plans only</u> as required in updated Return to Learn plans.

When making difficult decisions related to COVID-19, we will continue to communicate in a manner that is clear and actionable. We will only communicate when necessary outside of regular school updates.

It is important to note the following mitigation strategy:

The <u>CDC</u> issued an <u>Order</u> effective February 1, 2021, imposing a mask requirement on public transportation. The mask requirement <u>DOES</u> include school buses. The lowa Department of Public Health clarified how this federal order impacts the masking restrictions for schools in HF 847 (<u>IDPH</u> <u>Clarification</u>). Therefore, masks <u>will be</u> required on school busses to/from school and activities until further notice. Disposable masks will be available on each bus, but <u>we are asking families to provide</u> <u>masks for their students if they are able and encourage use on the bus</u>.
