- Accelerate the development of healthy, productive, and effective PLCs by leveraging leadership and resources.
- Analyze state assessment data including the lowa State Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) and the Conditions for Learning survey.
- Implement practices that support educational equity.
- Develop capacity to implement our instructional framework, New Teacher Center Core Teaching Capabilities.

TO DO THIS WE WILL...

- Build awareness of the Prairie Ready Indicators and how they will inform PK-12 decisionmaking and preparedness for post-high school education/training and career success.

Our ten-year goal is to create a personalized learning system built on guaranteed and viable curriculum & environments with a strong, multi-tiered system of supports.

SUCCESS WILL BE MEASURED ...

- A. By June of 2023, 80% of students will achieve a Meeting or Exemplary level on their initial attempt on District Common Assessments (DCAs) in literacy and math, indicating the impact of instruction in the Universal Tier.
- **B.** By June of 2023, increase the percent of students in each grade level cohort (4th - 11th) who score "proficient" and "advanced" on the lowa State Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP) from the previous year.
- C. By June of 2023, 80% of students in grades K-6 will meet benchmark goals on the spring FAST aReading assessment. (Composite score for K-1).
- **D.** By June of 2023, 80% of students in 4-year-old preschool will meet or exceed the targeted score on the spring myIGDIs literacy screener.
- E. By June of 2023, 85% of students or more will have 0-1 discipline referrals, fewer than 10% of students will have 2-5 discipline referrals and fewer than 5% of students will have 6 or more referrals.
- F. By June of 2023, maintain or increase our overall attendance rate of 95.6% and decrease the number of students who are chronically absent by 3%. (Comparison data is from the 2018-2019 school year.)
- G. By May of 2023, the graduation rate will be at least 95%.
- **H.** By June of 2023, increase the percentage of favorable responses to the "My School" questions within the School Perceptions Student Survey.
- I. By June of 2023, increase the percentage of favorable responses to the "People Indexes" questions within the School Perceptions Staff Survey.
