District Alert Notifications


The College Community School District utilizes a notification service for parental and staff outreach for emergency broadcasts. The system will place a phone call, email and text message to parents, guardians and Prairie staff in the event of a safety or weather related issue. You will receive a message from 319-848-5200 indicating the alert. The district will also post announcements on our district homepage, district social media channels, and local TV and radio stations.

News from the Activities Office

- Live Streaming. Introducing LIVE STREAM for home events at the Stadium and South Gym at the High School through National Federation of High Schools (NFHS). This includes freshman football played at John Wall Stadium. Click <u>HERE</u> for the link to the Prairie High School page on NFHS. <u>There is a charge to watch the live stream-you have the option per game or a yearly subscription to NFHS.</u> A yearly subscription will allow you to see all events on the network. Some of our opponents also use NFHS live streaming and you would be able to view those games too.
- Online ticketing. Avoid long lines at home events and purchase your digital ticket in advance through Bound. Cash sales will still be available for regular season home events at the door. Click <u>HERE</u> for the link to the Prairie High School page on Bound. Find your event and then click on the purchase ticket link
- Digital Activity Passes. Activity Passes are available for purchase through Bound.
 Click <u>HERE</u> for the link to the Prairie High School page on Bound, Click on "Tickets"
 and select "Activity Pass" to purchase your pass. If you purchase a family pass, your
 family members must join Bound (it's free) before you assign them the pass. Go to the
 same link, click Sign in in the upper right corner and then select Fan or Student to
 create your account.

Food & Nutrition


Breakfast and lunch is available to all students every school day. <u>Click here to watch</u> a quick video explaining lunch.



Free or Reduced Price Meal Information: If your household may qualify for free or reduced priced meals, please <u>click here</u> to complete the free or reduced price meal application. For applications translated into other languages please <u>click here</u>. Once an application is submitted to the Food and Nutrition office, the application is processed and an email or USPS letter will be sent to notify you what your household has qualified for. If your household qualifies for free or reduced price meals, you are also eligible for a waiver or reduction of fees. Fill out a fee waiver form to qualify.

Payments for meal accounts are made online through In Touch or in person through the school store in any building. All meal accounts are family accounts and all deposits are shared by everyone in the household. For online payments using In Touch: click here. You will login using your Infinite Campus PARENT PORTAL username. You will then click on the gray button that says "click here to set your password. (It is not automatically set to match your Infinite Campus portal password.) To view purchases or set spending or item limits, use the Total Access-Total K12 portal click here. A la carte options are available to all students. Students may only purchase a la carte items with a positive meal account balance. (A la carte is any item that is not included in a reimbursable meal like snacks, drinks, popcorn, a carton of milk (a meal comes with one carton.) etc.) Starting October 1st, Creek will no longer be limited to 2 a la carte items. Students are not able to purchase items for others. A la carte items must be purchased the first time through the line as students are not able to go back through the line a second time. Creek Parents/Guardians, please set charge limits on your student's purchases, as you see fit. Creek students that purchase a la carte items during their lunch period, are required to eat or discard any remaining items before returning to their classrooms. Also, Creek students who do not have their lunch card cannot purchase a la carte items.

Setting spending limits: Login to the Total Access parent portal. Under the settings tab, each student in your family account will have their own tab under settings. Click on the student you are setting limits for:

From here, you are able to allow or not allow breakfast and/or a la carte. You are also able to set a daily limit for breakfast and lunch spending. If you do not want to limit the account, you do not need to do anything; leave the amount at \$0.00. If you want to allow for a grade 5-6 lunch \$3.05 and \$2 of a la carte per day you would set the amount to \$5.05. Once you have set your limits, click on "update" to save your changes.
