Prairie students and families are on a roll with increasing student attendance! In the month of December of 2023, Prairie students were absent 25% fewer days than they were in December of 2022. We appreciate our students' and families' attention to making sure students are at school.

January can be a month when absence rates are high. Cold and flu season is upon us and respiratory illnesses are prevalent. During this time of year when missing school due to sickness is more common, it's even more important that students attend school when they are well.

As always, we encourage parents to keep students home when they are ill to allow them to recover and to prevent spreading illness to others. Thank you, Prairie families!

This week, Building Facilitators and Deans will be contacting parents via email if one or more students within the family have missed 10% or more of school time. Research shows that it's very common for students and parents to underestimate absences and attendance rates can improve simply by sharing the amount of missed school time with families.
