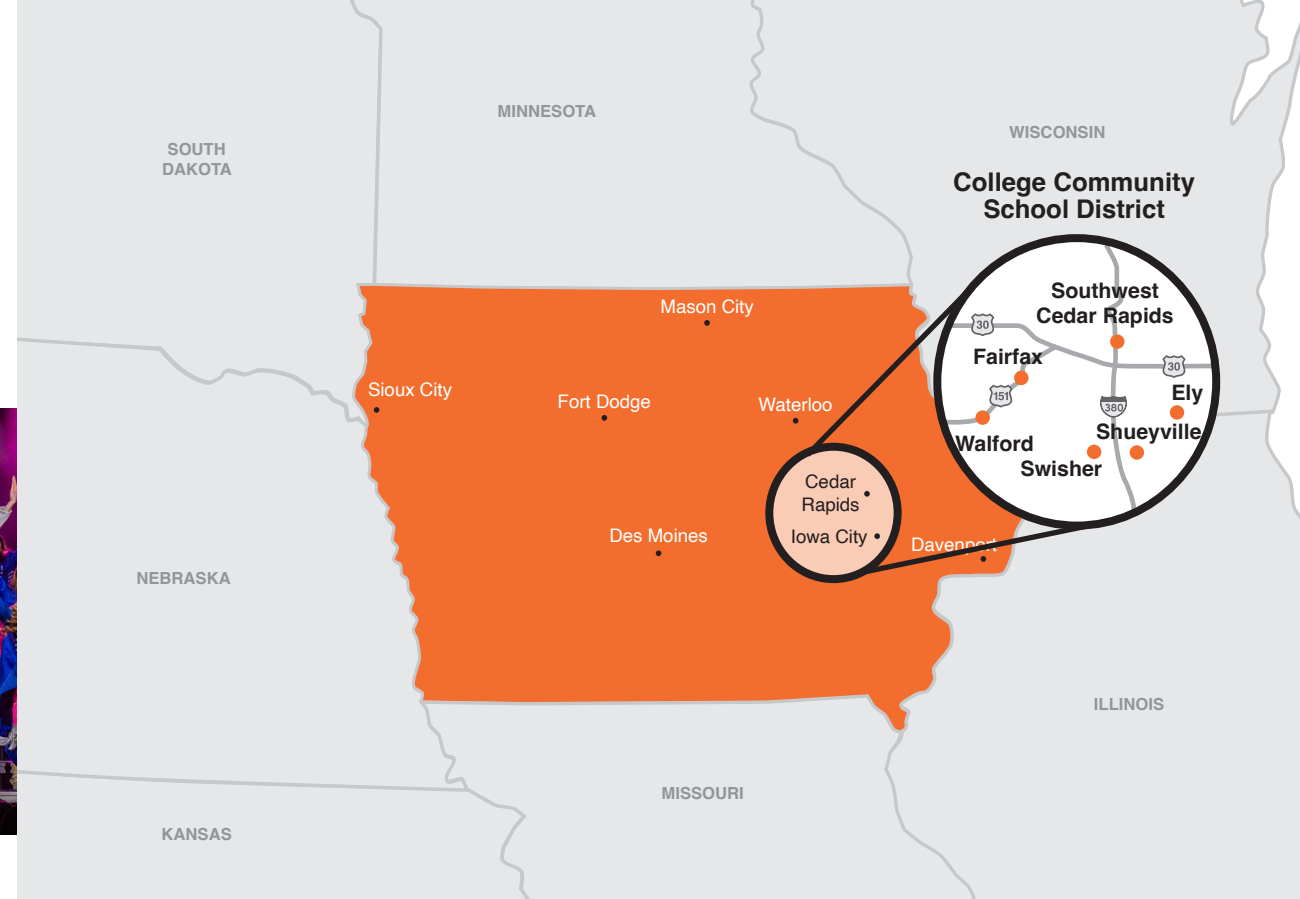
Did you know that our students in grades 7-12 recorded 14,300 volunteer hours at Prairie schools and throughout the community?

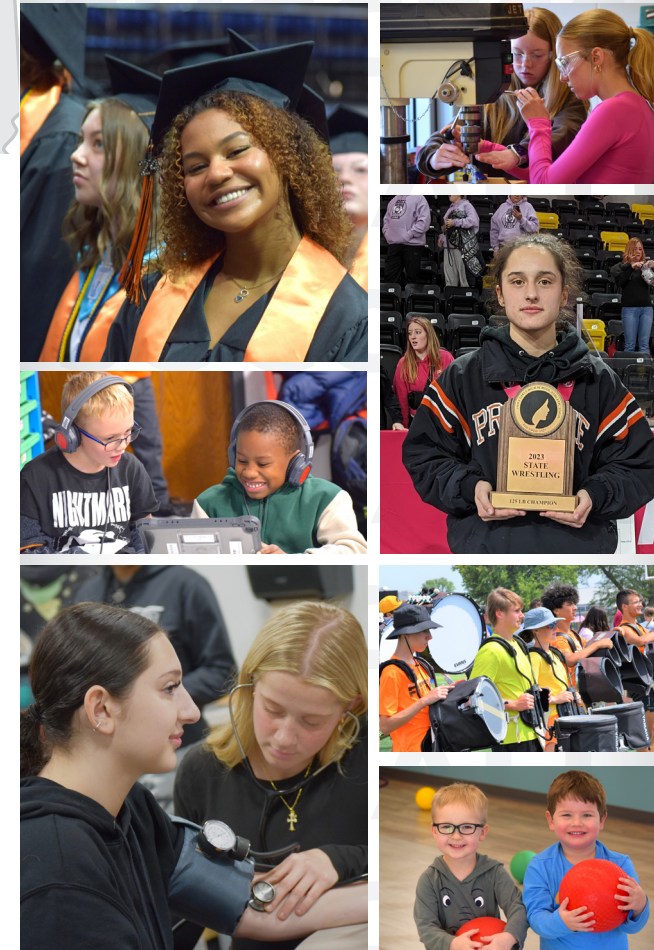

CENTRAL CAMPUS

The College Community School District's programs are located on a 500 acre site. The central campus site is unique for a district our size and a source of great pride for district patrons. The Prairie campus consists of five elementary schools (PK-4), an intermediate school (5-6), middle school (7-8), Ninth Grade Center (9), high school (10-12), Early Childhood Center, and three specialized sites.



CAREER ACADEMIES

College Community Schools implemented a Career Academy organizational structure at the secondary level to support students in selection and exploration of careers. Students have the opportunity to take courses that provide instruction, career pathways exploration, and workplace learning in selected career areas.
