Bus Driver Hiring Incentive and Current Staff Recruitment Bonus

College Community Schools is rolling out a new hiring bonus of \$500 for new bus drivers hired after June 1, 2025 for the 25-26 school year. The hiring bonus will be paid in two \$250 installments. The first \$250 will be received after completing 60 working days and the second \$250 payment will be made after 90 working days. Additionally, the starting hourly wage for bus drivers is \$24.10/hr.

In order to expand our bus driving team, College Community Schools is also implementing a **\$400** recruitment bonus for all *current staff members* who recruit a bus driver to the district. The recruitment bonus will be paid to the current staff member who recruited a new bus driver in two \$200 installments. The first \$200 payment will be made after the recruited bus driver completes 60 working days at College Community Schools, and the second \$200 payment will be made after they complete 90 working days.
